8. Teaching methodologies:

The classes will be held in english, and are both theoretical and practical, alternating exposition and dialogue with students on practical aspects, critical analysis of international jurisprudence and solving cases.

9. Evaluation:

The evaluation, in accordance with the appliable regulations, has two parts: a) The evaluation elements, based on the active participation of students in discussions and solving of cases, the solving of a case in writing and the oral presentation, in a team, of an international judicial decision.; b) A final written exam. Students are encouraged to take an oral exam to improve their grade.

The theoretical exposition enables students with the capacity to develop their skills through practical exercises that endow a critical analysis of the juridical concepts and institutions of the diplomatic and consular relations, allowing the assimilation of the methodology for solving cases in this discipline.
