The technological evolution that we witness is faster than legal changes and may collide with the Law actually in force, typically built on a physical basis. This raises effectiveness, efficiency, and fairness problems and demands new and dynamic legal solutions that still have to be in line with the existing legal system.

The course will have an interdisciplinary and comparative approach by analysing the phenomenon from different legal approaches and branches.

- 2. Oral discussion of the paper or case study completed during the course, individually and/or in groups -80%
