	be accepted any Certificate (Cambridge, TOEFL) or any statement from the University attesting the proficiency level . No official language certificate is required. OBS - For students that only want to follow courses lectured in portuguese must submit a declaration stating that they will follow classes in portuguese and won't follow courses in english.
